Community & Economic Development

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will support legislation that empowers municipalities to expand the economy of Miami-Dade County through the creation of job and business development opportunities. Such legislation should:

Enact an urban economic development policy that acknowledges and puts to use Miami-Dade County's physical, natural and human resources:

Support the efforts of municipalities to revitalize their centers of commerce and culture by promoting redevelopment and infill development through policies that fund public infrastructure projects, encourage public/private partnerships, and leverage state funds or credits to attract private investment;

Fund grant programs that create and/or enhance cultural facilities and public parks within municipalities;

Support energy efficiency and renewable energy incentives for all Floridians, including programs that enhance single-family, multifamily condominiums and cooperatives, commercial and industrial properties while maintaining accountability;

Support the increase in funding for Performance Based Tax Incentives which positively impacts South Florida (Film industry is one example.); and

Support the increase in funding for Low Cost Financing Mechanisms for Water & Sewer needs within municipalities and regional areas.

Election Reform

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will support Miami-Dade County's proposed changes that promote the fair and equal opportunity of all registered voters to vote in elections.

Law Enforcement

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will support legislation that expands the criteria for use of law enforcement trust fund dollars to include certain law enforcement non-recurring capital expenditures, which create or expand physical facilities, purchase equipment that extend capabilities or otherwise increase law enforcement service programs and/or related initiatives.

Pension Reform

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will continue to support legislation that provides comprehensive municipal pension reform. Any such comprehensive pension-reform legislation should address the following:

Allow local governments to deviate from state requirements or change to a pension plan that best suits the municipalities short-term and long-terms needs and conditions;

Change the governance structure of pension boards of trustees to move away from having plan participants serve on the boards;

Remove statutory provisions requiring that municipalities and other governments offer post-employment benefits (subsidized health and other insurance coverage to retirees);

Require average final compensation in defined-benefit pension plans be defined to include salary only, excluding pay for overtime, unused leave time or any other additional payments;

Modify the current statutory disability presumptions for firefighters, law enforcement officers, and correctional officers relating to tuberculosis, heart disease, or hypertension; and

Allow recipients of insurance premium tax revenues to use these funds to pay for the costs of current plans and to lower required plan contributions from the plan sponsor and to continue to receive such funds.

Gun Safety

The Miami-Dade League of Cities will support legislation that allows municipalities the ability to ban any person from carrying a concealed weapon or firearm into a public park or public playground and/or any public community center.



Citizens Property Insurance Corporation

The Miami-Dade League of Cities will support legislation that supports the six core values of the State's property insurance corporation (public service, integrity, respect, courtesy, responsiveness and fairness). Such legislation should:

Increase the Board of Governors of Citizens from eight to nine members and have the ninth member be appointed by the President of the Florida League of Cities:

Require Citizens to have an Inspector General;

Cap rate increases for new and existing policy holders; and

Allow a fair system for re-inspections and an accurate assessment for property owners.

Local Option Fuel Tax

The Miami-Dade League of Cities will support legislation that addresses the discrepancies among interpretations of the Local Option Fuel Tax, especially by the Office of the Attorney General, as well as expanding the definition of "transportations expenditures" to include installation, operation and maintenance in the categories of "roadway and right-of-way drainage; street lightning; traffic signs, and traffic engineering, signalization, and pavement markings."

PROPOSED FDOT AMENDMENT TO MARKING METER REVENUE

The Miami-Dade League of Cities opposes legislation amending Section 337.408, Florida Statutes authorizing the installation of parking meters in the right of way of a state road only by FDOT permit while requiring counties and municipalities to provide fifty (50%) of the revenue generated by said meters to FDOT.

Early Cost Recovery

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will support legislation that eliminates the Florida Public Service Commission's ability to approve any Early Cost Recovery measures and that repeals the Early Cost Recovery statute.

Electrical Transmission Lines

The Miami-Dade County League of Cities will support legislation that addresses the following issues with regard to electrical transmission lines:

Require the undergrounding of transmission lines or the selection of alternative corridors, when meant to lessen health, visual blight and environmental impacts in highly dense urban areas and place the burden of proof on the utility;

Request the Public Service Commission revisit its decision that only the requesting municipality be required to pay for the costs associated with undergrounding transmission lines;

Request that the Florida Legislature require one appointment to the Public Service Commission be made by the President of the Florida League of Cities: and

Institute a cost-sharing policy for all Florida ratepayers for the costs associated with the undergrounding of transmission lines for projects that originate directly from nuclear facilities or that are of a significant size [more than ten (10) miles] in urban areas.


